For example, 'can you see the bear on the front cover? Where do you think he will go?'





Numbots is an online game and playing little and often will significantly improve your child's recall and understanding of number bonds and addition and subtraction facts. These are critical foundations in maths so we are excited about the impact that Numbots will have. The children have been shown how to login and have brought home a username label inside their reading record. This is the same username and password that they use for Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Stars. There's nothing stopping our older children in the school from joining in too!

PARENTS' EVENING: Further to the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings a couple of weeks ago, parents will have the opportunity to make an individual appointment with their child's class teacher on <u>Tuesday</u>, 17th October. The teachers will be able to report on how well your child has settled in this academic year and discuss individual targets to support your child's progress. A five minute appointment between 3:30-5:15 p.m. can be made and the teachers will be out on the playground after school each day next week so that parents can make an appointment that is most convenient for them. Alternatively, make a phone call to the office and the staff will be able to slot you in for a suitable time to suit you.

PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL: Parents/carers who drive to school for drop off and pick up will be aware of the double yellow lines on the streets surrounding the school. These lines are there to remind drivers **NOT** to park there so that other road users and pedestrians are safe. It is **illegal** to park on double yellow lines.
