In this Sunday's Gospel, when the storm starts tossing the boat around, the disciples still don't seem to recognise that Jesus is in control. Storms, stress and upsets can sometimes be part of our lives. **SAFETY IN THE SUNSHINE:** The weather forecast next week is for warmer temperatures and sunshine (at last!). To ensure that we can all enjoy the sunshine as well as staying safe. Let's work together:

<u>What can parents do?</u> Please keep the footwear safe - NO flip flops, sliders, open toe shoes - these are not suitable for school. Children also need to wear socks to protect their feet. Please apply suncream to any exposed skin before coming to school. Provide sun hats/caps, sunglasses. Please send in a bottle of water so this can be refilled throughout the day.



<u>What will staff in school do?</u> We will ensure your child is hydrated with plenty of water. Help children to spend time in shaded areas outside and classrooms will be well ventilated. Additional breaks from school work for rest times. Calming activities inside following time outside.

<u>KNIFE CRIME WORKSHOP</u>: It was with deep regret that we needed to postpone the knife crime workshop for our Year 5 and 6 pupils and their parents/carers last week. The good news is the lady delivering the workshop has managed to fit us in with an alternative date before we break up for the summer holidays. We are delighted about this as our staff feel that the workshop will be of great benefit to our Year 5 but especially our Year 6 pupils as they transition to their respective high schools. <u>HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING</u>: Are you claiming all of the benefits that you're entitled to? Use one of these benefits calculators to determine whether there are any benefits that you could be claiming: Click on <u>Turn2us</u> or <u>Policy in Practice</u>

Click on <u>Support for migrant families</u> and use this calculator if you are a migrant family, or if you have no recourse to public funds (meaning you're not entitled to the majority of welfare benefits)

You may be able to get benefits paid early if you need cash urgently - this is known as 'a short-term benefit advance'. You will need to contact the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) office that is handling your claim.

## E-SAFETY TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: REMEMBER, YOU'RE IN CHARGE!

No matter what, remember you're the parent/carer. Set boundaries and consider using filtering software and parent controls on devices (but be aware that this is only part of the solution). There are a lot of options for parental controls on the market.
