



SLEEP - as adults we know how difficult it is to function without enough sleep. Did you know....

- ✓ Children 3 to 5 years old should sleep 10 to 13 hours per day.
- ✓ Children 6 to 12 years old should sleep 9 to 12 hours per day.

Over the half term, try and get your children into a good sleep pattern even if it means just increasing it by 15 minutes a day. Your life will be much easier if your child gets the required sleep each night.

<u>PARENTS</u>, <u>WE NEED YOUR HELP...:</u> You are your child's first teacher. As always, we continue to work in partnership for the good of all our children. They are all special to us - they all grow, develop and flourish in their own time and in their own way. This is something we celebrate. Sometimes we need to work together to reinforce messages and lessons at home and at school. Could you help us with the following things during half term?

<u>HEAD LICE</u>: It would be very unusual for your child NOT to get headlice during their school life. It is very common. Please continue to follow advice from the NHS about how to treat and avoid getting headlice. Please be extra vigilent when washing and treating your child's hair.

<u>HAND-WASHING</u>, <u>RESPIRATORY & TOILET HYGIENE</u>: This is something we all teach. Please take the time during the break to reinforce the importance of personal hygiene. We all know children forget so your support with this would be greatly appreciated.

<u>PANTS:</u> Please speak to your child (appropriate for their age) about their's and other people's private parts - what we are allowed and not allowed to do. Of course we teach about this in our curriculum but it would really help staff if you could have timely conversations with your child too. READING. Your child doesn't have to read an entire book in one go! Any time spent sharing or talking about a book is beneficial, even if it's just a couple of minutes at a time. If they have to close the book early because it's time for tea, or they're just losing interest, that's okay. Reading can take a lot of mental energy and taking breaks gives children a chance to slowly build the mental stamina they need, so that soon they will be able to read for longer stretches of time.
