TOP TIPS FOR ATTENDANCE: Particularly now that the weather is getting colder, it's important children have got the appropriate clothing - warm coats, hats, gloves and scarves, thermal vests, tights or thick socks. All of this will help keep them warm when they're outside. Please encourage them to learn to fasten up their coats. All of these additional layers will take extra time to put on in the mornings, especially if you have a few children to get ready. Please allow yourselves extra time for this as well as defrosting your car if needs be too!!
